IMYB (International Meeting of Young Beekeepers[®]) is the world's largest gathering of young beekeepers. This annual competition serves as a unique platform for young beekeeping enthusiasts worldwide to exhibit their skills, foster global networks, and share best practices. It is organized by the ICYB (International Centre of Young Beekeepers), a non-profit organization from the Czech Republic, dedicated to supporting young beekeepers worldwide.

Since 2010, over 1,000 young beekeepers, from more than 43 different countries, have participated and represented their national colors.

- Approved countries will be contacted by **10**th June 2024.
- Approved countries must complete the €1,000 participation fee by 1st July 2024.
- Failure to pay on time will result in the spot being offered to the next country on the waiting list.

Please ensure compliance with these deadlines to secure your participation in IMYB UAE 2024.

PARTICIPANTS

- Spaces are limited to 20 participating country.
- Each team comprises three young individuals aged 12 to 18. Team members must not turn 18 during the event

- Each team must comprise of one or two adult supervisors responsible for the team members throughout their stay.





Beekeeping in the UAE

Beekeeping and honey hunting have been an integral part of the United Arab Emirates' (UAE) traditional way of life for centuries. The country's arid climate and unique geography provide ideal conditions for honey production, and the Bedouin people, in particular, have honed their skills in beekeeping and honey hunting over generations.

Traditional Emirati beekeeping practices involve the use of cylindrical clay hives called "mazari," and palm tree logs, which are placed in the desert or mountainous regions, where bees can feed on the nectar of local plants. Honey hunting, on the other hand, involves finding wild beehives in the mountains, using smoke to subdue the bees, and collecting honey from the hive. Today, while modern beekeeping techniques have largely replaced traditional practices in the UAE, some Emirati families continue to practice traditional beekeeping and honey hunting as a way to preserve their cultural heritage.

It was the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan who took beekeeping to the next level. As the Ruler's Representative of Al Ain in the 1950s, Sheikh Zayed recognized the vital role that bees played as pollinators and sought to promote beekeeping in the region.


This vision of Sheikh Zayed's was not limited to his own country. As one of the world's greatest philanthropists with a US\$50 billion legacy, he championed the use of bees to improve lives across the developing world. Beginning in the 1970s, he became an apiculturist-president in order to underpin his extraordinary philanthropy.

Sheikh Zayed's ambitions were reflected in a 1977 letter produced by Britain's Foreign and Commonwealth Office. The letter showed a series of exports from Britain to Abu Dhabi, and how many of these found their way across the developing world. Millions of bees were re-exported from Abu Dhabi International Airport to support some of Sheikh Zayed's remarkable activities.

Through these programs, Sheikh Zayed sought to expand bee populations and increase honey and wax production by cooperating with existing master growers. Often working in tandem with the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), cultivation of bee-attracting plant species was encouraged, and commercial honey production was promoted as a means of increasing income for rural communities.

Today, the legacy of Sheikh Zayed's beekeeping efforts can still be seen in the UAE and beyond. His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Deputy Supreme Commander of the UAE Armed Forces, has continued this legacy by supporting initiatives such as the Mohamed bin Zayed Species Conservation Fund (MBZ Fund), which has helped to conserve populations of rare bees in Europe.

Sheikh Zayed's vision of beekeeping as a means of improving lives and promoting sustainable development continues to inspire and influence beekeeping practices around the world. His legacy serves as a reminder of the important role that bees play in our global agricultural system and the need to protect and promote their well-being.



Modernization and Innovations in UAE's Beekeeping Industry

In recent years, beekeeping has emerged as a growing industry in the country. According to the Ministry of Climate Change and Environment, it is estimated that there are over 900 beekeepers in the UAE, with around 22,000 bee colonies. These beekeepers produce an estimated 1,200 metric tons of honey each year, with an average yield of 50-60 kilograms of honey per colony, which are mainly consumed locally. With one of the highest per capita honey consumers in the world, with an estimated 1.2 kilograms of honey consumed per person per year, this demand has driven the growth of the commercial beekeeping industry, with many local and international companies investing in the sector.

The beekeeping industry is highly dependent on the country's unique climate and vegetation patterns. There are two primary honey seasons in the UAE, with the first season taking place from April to May and known as the Samr season (Acacia Tortilis). The second honey season in the UAE occurs from October to November and is known as the Sidr season (Ziziphus Spina-Christi). In addition to the Samr and Sidr honey seasons, there are a few other types of honey harvested, such as Mangroves, Ghaf, and wild-flowers.

With the support of government initiatives and educational entities, beekeeping in the UAE is becoming a thriving business, with both commercial and scientific interests.

The UAE government is also investing in the beekeeping industry, with initiatives such as the Abu Dhabi Agriculture and Food Safety Authority's (ADAFSA) Bee Health Program. ADAFSA's initiatives

include the registration and licensing of beekeepers, the monitoring of honey quality, and the promotion of beekeeping as a sustainable agricultural practice. The program aims to improve the health and productivity of honeybees in the UAE by providing training and support to beekeepers, as well as conducting research on bee health and disease

In addition, the Fujairah Research Center for Agriculture and Fisheries (FRC) has a dedicated beekeeping section that conducts research on bee biology, honey production, and bee disease management. The center manages 20+ apiaries & honey park reserve, partnering with national and international groups to research and address beekeeping industry challenges. Areas of focus include best hive management practices, biodynamic properties of bee products, and identifying native plants for honey pro-duction. New technologies like Smart Hives and Bee Counters are also being explored to support beekeepers. Research results will be shared to promote sustainable development in the UAE's beekeeping industry.


